MESSAGE OF THE ICCFM PRESIDENTS

Greetings of peace and goodwill!



We start our 2nd Semester of 2021 with no less than Cardinal Anders Arborelius, O. C.D of Sweden as our resource speaker who will share his reflection on "Saint Joseph in our Life". This topic is most appropriate at this time. Last December 8, 2020, Pope Francis announced a year dedicated to Saint Joseph to mark the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. This is to remind us of his role as protector of the entire family of God, the Church. For the celebration of the 55th year Foundation day of the International Confederation of Christian Family Movements (ICCFM) on September 4 (instead of September 7 which is working day), we have invited as Keynote speaker no less than Sister Patricia Crowley, the daughter of Patrick and Patty Crowley, one of the founding members of ICCFM.

We end 2021 with an Advent recollection as a time for spiritual awakening and renewal for us all as we prepare for the coming birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. We are lucky to have as our Advent recollection speakers, in spite of their heavy schedules, Bishop Msgr. Peter Martin Musikuwa, Bishop of Chiwawa and Fr. P. Claude N. Nonis S.T.D., National Chaplain of Family & Life, SriLanka. They will discuss "Advent in a Synodal Church: Challenges and Opportunities". Our 2021 Christmas party is a family celebration via zoom in five continents, a world community remembering with joy the birth of Jesus!

The year 2022 has turned out to be an eventful year for the ICCFM with the easing of Covid 19 restrictions. It started with the invitation by the Dicastery of the Laity, Family and Life to attend the 2022 World Meeting of Families in Rome on June 22-26, 2022. The ICCFM Team that attended the event was composed of Bishop Gerardo A. Alminaza, Fr. Saul Ragotia, Fr Joseph Alexander De Leon, Pip & Wilma Cua, Jorge & Rosalinda Carrillo, Sergio & Dora Trevino, Marcos & Alicia Alvarez, Marco & Martha Campoy, Ricardo & Lucia Araujo.

The theme was "Family Love: a Vocation and a Path to Holiness." The various topics and reflections during this event were filled with inspiring experiences and interestingly the resource persons/sharers used the CFM/MFC's OJA method in their presentations.

Allow us to quote some snippets of what Pope Francis said in his homily during the concluding Eucharistic celebration in the said World Meeting of Families:

* On Mission for Catholic families - "Proclaim the beauty of

being family with joy! Proclaim the grace of Christian marriage to children and young people."

*He invited young families to "be guided by those who know the way," and more established families to "be companions on the journey for others". And for families who have lost the way, he encouraged them not to be overcome by sadness, but to "trust in the love that God has placed in you, [and] beseech the Spirit each day to revive it."

*He said, "Be the seed of a more fraternal world! Be families with big hearts! Be the welcoming face of the Church! And please pray, always pray!"

Let us take heed of what Pope Francis said as they are helpful guides in our work of evangelization. Mission and Prayer come together.

This trip to Rome gave the Team the opportunity to make missionary visits to Portugal, Malta,

Spain, Sweden, Hungary and Prague. Aside from meeting the leaders and some members of CFM-MFC in the countries visited, these visits turned out to be a learning experience for all of us. Indeed, there is an urgent need to attract more young couples into the movement. New CFM/MFC units have to be put up and nurtured. Existing programs and books have to be reviewed and updated to make them relevant to the times.

Yes, there are so many challenges to beat and hurdles to overcome. ICCFM needs to put time, energy and resources to address specific issues and undertake positive, achievable, relevant and time bound solutions.

To Saint Therese, our mission saint, please continue to pray for us!

We end 2022 with great anticipation and excitement as we look forward to the forthcoming Continental Assemblies of Asia and Latin America this November. Let us pray for the success of these events.

We wish you all the best as you continue to strive for excellence in the field of evangelization. MESSAGE International Chaplain

"Family Love: a Vocation and a Path to Holiness"



This was the theme of the Tenth World Meeting of Families held last June 22-26, 2022 in Rome where ICCFM was well represented by our ICCFM Officers and some national delegations where we are actively present.

From beginning to end, the personal love of the Holy Father was very visible and palpable. Among other things in his homily at the Closing Mass, Pope Francis reminded participants that:

1. "The family is the place of encounter, of sharing, of going forth from ourselves in order to welcome others and stand beside them... We must never forget that the family is

the first place where we learn to love."

- 2. "...In praising the beauty of the family, we also feel compelled, today more than ever, to <u>defend the family.</u> Let us not allow the family to be poisoned by the toxins of selfishness, individualism, today's culture of indifference and culture of waste, and as a result lose its very DNA, which is the spirit of acceptance and service."
- 3. Parents need to reflect on God's way of acting: "God is not anxious and overprotective; on the contrary, he trusts young people and he calls each of them to scale the heights of life and of mission." Parents need not shield their children "from the slightest hardship and suffering, but to try to communicate to them a passion for life, to arouse in them the desire to discover their vocation and embrace the great mission that God has in mind for them."
- 4. "When Jesus calls, also in the case of marriage and family life, he asks us to keep looking ahead, and he always precedes us on the way. He always precedes us in love and service. And those who follow him will not be disappointed!"

5. "It is not an easy journey: there will be dark moments, moments of difficulty in which we will think that it is all over. May the love you share with one another be always <u>open</u>, <u>directed outwards</u>, <u>capable of</u> "touching" the weak and wounded, the frail in body and the frail in spirit, and <u>all whom you meet along the</u> way. For love, including family love, is purified and strengthened whenever it is shared with others."





"Knowing MFC at the Latin American Level"



Knowing MFC at the Latin American Level is a project initiated by the Secretariat for Latin America 2017-2022 of the Latin American Christian Family Movement. It involves all 18 countries and has well-defined objectives, allowing interested MFC members to directly learn about the functioning of MFC in different countries through the accounts of the protagonists and leaders of MFC in each country.

This project arises from the need to delve into the knowledge of the lived experiences, methodologies of recruitment and formation, strategies for member retention, and organizational structures in different countries. Its purpose is to fulfill the objective of MFC, which is the evangelization and promotion of the family by developing its human and Christian values, and training it to fulfill its mission as a forming of persons, educator in faith, promoter of the common good, and defender of life.

In different countries, MFC experiences vary in terms of structures, services, sensibilities, opportunities, and limitations. The document "This is MFC: Its Being, Its Life, and Its Action" serves as a guide to understand the history and direction of the Christian Family Movement regarding its objective, charisma, mission, essence, and apostolic action. However, the developed chapters aim to provide a concrete understanding of the pastoral action of MFC in different countries, including contributions, legacies, evolution, and limitations.

The technical details of the project are as follows:

Project Name: Knowing the MFC at the Latin American Level

Responsibles: Secretariat for Latin America and National Teams of MFC

Program Modality: Live in-person and virtual program conducted through platforms like Zoom and Facebook Live, organized by SPLA and featuring participation from different member countries of MFC Latin America.

Format: Periodic broadcasts showcasing the history, legacy, apostolic action, and projects of MFC in each country.

Schedule: Sundays at 20:00 (Paraguay time).

Duration: 2 hours.



Justification: Analyzing the Latin American Assemblies (AGLAS), we have observed that the assigned time for representatives from each country is limited and insufficient to present and share the different actions, achievements, and projects undertaken by each country. Therefore, we believe it is necessary to provide a more suitable and exclusive time for each MFC-present country, currently 18 countries, to expose the MFC experience in their respective countries. This will allow all MFC leaders and members participating in the program to expand their knowledge of the movement.

The format consists of periodic broadcasts covering the history, legacy, apostolic action, and projects of MFC in each country, with a duration of approximately 2 hours, scheduled on Sundays in the late evening according to a predetermined and shared calendar with the countries.

General Objective:

 To present and make known the life, various actions, structure, achievements, and projects of MFC in each country to all MFC leaders and members in Latin America.

Specific Objectives:

- Understand the history and functioning of MFC in each country.
- Familiarize with the actions, methodology, organizational unity, and growth materials available in each country's MFC.
- Identify the legacy and importance of MFC in each country.
- Detail the different action plans and projects of MFC in each country.
- Encourage all MFC members to get to know MFC.

Program Outline: The program is flexible and should be tailored to the presentation objectives of each National Team. The participation of the country can be led by the national presidents or by an appointed individual, couple, or group to animate the program.

The aspects that must necessarily be covered include:

- **History of MFC in the country:** Foundation date, founers.
- Membership: Married couples, youth, adolescents, children, widows, separated individuals, and divorced compared to 2019/2020/2021.
- Organizational Structure: Regions, dioceses, parishes, sectors, other structures.
- Formation Methodology within the MFC: Formation in basic teams, materials used, number of members per team.

- Community Service: Services offered outside the MFC
- Ongoing Projects: Projects currently being undertaken.
- Upcoming Projects: Projects being prepared for the future.
- Specific Data and Information: Any country-specific information to be shared.
- Q&A Session: A series of questions and answers that arise as a result of the program.



Expected Outcome:

The project aims to achieve the following results:

- Opportunity for leaders to showcase how the MFC operates in their country.
- Different members of the Latin American MFC gaining a general understanding of the situation and experience of the MFC in each country.
- Future leaders of the Latin American MFC being able to develop their work programs based on the reality presented by different countries.

 Latin American unity among different countries, supporting the participation of each country.



Final Project Benefit:

- **For the MFC country:** To showcase its history, work, and activities in an extensive manner.
- For MFC leaders: To gain knowledge of the reality in different countries, their successes, and the possibility to conduct internal improvement diagnostics.
- For MFC members: To have a broader perspective beyond their particular experience in their basic team, sector, diocese, and country.

Condition to Enable the Project:

Total commitment from all **members of the different National Teams,** supporting the presentations of different countries and preparing their own.

Program Schedule:

A calendar has been established that covers 20 chapters, with each country being a chapter, from November 2021 to October 2022.

In Summary:

The experience of presenting different countries has been highly enriching and motivating, and we consider each of the 15 chapters already developed by the countries a success.

IX EXTRAORDINARY ASSEMBLY OF THE LATIN AMERICAN MFC

Given that the pandemic had not yet been overcome and there was no idea of when the

restrictive measures would be lifted, and considering that in November 2021, under





normal conditions, the Secretariat for Latin America - SPLA should convene the XXX Ordinary Assembly for the change of authorities, it was necessary to seek the opinion of the different countries. The decision was made to convene the IX Extraordinary General Assembly of Latin America in a virtual format on March 21, 2021, with the following agenda:

- 1. Reschedule the date of the Ordinary General Assembly, originally planned for November 22-24, 2021, to a new date to be agreed upon.
- 2. Reschedule the deadlines established in Article 16 of the statutes of the Christian Family Movement in Latin America, in accordance with the approved rescheduling of the Ordinary General Assembly.

The general rationale behind these decisions was as follows:

Ensure that National Presidents, Ecclesial Advisors, and guests attending the Ordinary General Assembly for the change of authorities, whose presence is mandatory, would not face any health or legal issues related to travel and vaccination against COVID. Additionally, it was important to consider that the conditions and possibilities of COVID transmission were not high, had been reduced, and if possible, controlled in the different member countries of the MFCLA.

It is worth noting that the assembly achieved a 100% attendance and participation rate from eligible members, which is remarkable and encouraging in terms of a sense of belonging, willingness to collaborate, and the identity of the CFM in all Latin American countries. All 18 member countries participated, along with the members of the SPLA Team and the Former PRELAS Period 2013-2017, as well as current advisers Lucy and Ricardo Araujo Castro, and Doris and Sergio Treviño, Vice Presidents of the International Confederation of Christian Family Movements.

During the assembly, four proposals were presented:

- Proposal 1: Postpone the assembly to July 15, 16 & 17, 2022.
- Proposal 2: Postpone the assembly to November 4, 5, & 6 2022.
- Proposal 3: Postpone the assembly to July 8, 9 & 10, 2022.
- Proposal 4: Postpone the assembly to November 11, 12 & 13, 2022.

At the beginning of the assembly, the Latin American Advisor, Father Marcos Wilk, delivered a message to the assembly members, Inviting them to reflect on the "Family as the Domestic Church." He highlighted four truths: 1) Family life is sacred; 2) Family activity is holy; 3) The family has a unique ministry: helping to discover and value the gifts of each member; and 4) The faith of a family is an evangelizing community. He concluded by inviting everyone to seek the intercession of Saint Joseph for families and ended with a prayer to the saint as a Good Father, followed by the recitation of the Hail Mary.

The entire assembly unanimously approved Proposal 4, which consists of extending the current term of the SPLA team for one more year.

It was also unanimously authorized for the current PRELAS, Alicia and Marcos Álvarez, to continue in their positions until the next Ordinary General Assembly, which was scheduled.

The Latin American Presidents, Alicia and Marcos Álvarez-Quiñonez, offered a final reflection expressing that the CFM continues to be a work of God, responding to God's plan within His salvific work for humanity by promoting and protecting the family, which is a sign of God's love for humanity, a heritage of humanity, and a sanctuary of life.

They emphasized that as a work of God, the CFM belongs to God, and it is our responsibility to follow and maintain His plan for the salvation of mankind (our own salvation) through the conversion of our families.



SIXTH LATIN AMERICAN MEETING OF YOUTH (20, 21 & 22 April 2022)

In May 2022, the long-awaited Sixth Latin American Youth Encounter (VI ELAJO) took place, with Costa Rica as the host country and the theme "Youth committed to the evangelization of the Latin American family." This grand event was held at the San Benito Salesian Spiritual Center in the city of Heredia. Young representatives from 13 countries participated, along with married couples and pastoral assistants from Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Peru, Dominican Republic, Paraguay, and Bolivia, bringing representation and identity to the gathering.

The three days were filled with moments of prayer, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, reflection, conferences following the See, Judge, Act methodology, musical animation by the Servidei group, dynamics, games, a rally, and integration activities.

The structure of the VI ELAJO followed the same guidelines as previous ELAJO events, based on the methodology proposed by the Latin

American Church of Seeing, Judging, and Acting. The topics developed during the encounter were organized as follows:



See: "Youth: Perspectives, Issues, and Challenges" always in line with the theme "Youth committed to the evangelization of the Latin American family." This session focuses on the global problems that young people face, including their family dynamics and their involvement in the MFC.

It presents an analysis from the speaker's perspective, placing participants in their current role and encouraging them to share their own experiences. The session explores the strengths and vulnerabilities of young people in their personal lives, families, and within the Church through the MFC.

Reference: The Parable of the Prodigal Son, Luke 15:11-16, which highlights the reality experienced by the prodigal son, his possessions, his actions, and his current situation.

Judge: "The Youth as a Path of Evangelization" always in line with the theme "Youth committed to the evangelization of the Latin American family." This session focuses on taking ownership of one's reality, training, and mission in personal life, family, and the Church through the MFC.

Reference: The Parable of the Prodigal Son, Luke 15:17-19, where the prodigal son

becomes aware of his reality and reflects upon it.

Act: "Youth committed to the evangelization of the Latin American family" from the perspective of Area VI, summarizing the reality of young people who are called not only to be the future but also to be the architects of their own lives, their families, and the Church through the MFC.

Reference: The Parable of the Prodigal Son, Luke 15:20-24, where the prodigal son takes concrete action and is fully rewarded by the Father.

The spiritual closeness of all participants was emphasized throughout the VI ELAJO. The event was dynamic, as young people typically prefer, with games such as the rally, a Latin American-themed evening party, and moments of prayer and reflection. Several priests, bishops, and the Apostolic Nuncio of the Holy See in Costa Rica accompanied the activity. The Apostolic Nuncio read and delivered a greeting from His Holiness Pope Francis for this event.

"The young people of the Latin American MFC fulfill Pope Francis' mandate to make a joyful noise, and let it be an ordered noise."



Undoubtedly, one of the most beautiful moments was the visit of the Apostolic Nuncio of Costa Rica, His Excellency Bruno Musaró, who brought us the word of the Holy Father, both in person and from a distance. Part of the message said the following: "May you discern your calling as evangelizers, fearless witnesses of the light of faith, and bring the message of salvation to the families of Latin America, even to the most forgotten peripheries of that beloved continent." In this way, Pope Francis ignited the hearts of those present and entrusted us with a great mission.

Finally, after examining the reality they are facing (See), making value judgments (Judge), each country has taken on commitments (Act) that they will carry out with a strong conviction to be true evangelizers of the Latin American family.



CFM EUROPE

MÉCS (CFM/FIRES) HUNGARY Activities from July 2021 to Dec 2021

I. The most significant event in the life of CFM/FIRES in Hungary was the **change of leadership**.



On 28 August 2021, after several years of preparation, Balázs and Krisztina Ménesi, President couple of CFM/FIRES Hungary, handed over the leadership of CFM/FIRES Hungary after their 25 years of service to a Presidential Team of four couples, who together, working in different areas (FIRES programs, CFM groups, Organizational and Legal Background, CFM Youth, Prayer Background), will lead CFM/FIRES Hungary. Norbert and Bernadett Dévényi have been appointed as the current national President couple.



II. CFM groups

The past two years were varied with lot of challenges for our groups.

We cannot say real tendencies or typical cases, but we could see that all groups who considered important to keep their group alive, and meet each other, found their own way to do it.

Most of them used online techniques for their meetings. Some of them used it only as an emergency solution, but a lot of them found the potential to improve these meetings, and it could increase the presence of married couple too. As a clear benefit, some groups still use this mode as an alternative for members who cannot join to the meeting for any reason.



Some groups preferred to go outside during their meetings. Some of them kept them parallel with their "normal" regular meetings.

Unfortunately, some of groups did not survive this period, but it seems that pandemic was more likely an excuse than the reason for the termination of their groups.

Also, many new communities were established during this period, and we could see that the real connection became more important than before, and people were looking for these opportunities.



As a summary we can say that our groups showed creativity to survive this period and most of them were strengthened, but some of them need real support to get their momentum back.

III. FIRES Encounter programs

With the improving pandemic situation we have re-started our retreats in the fall of 2021 with a lot of hope. Everybody personally has experienced difficulties, tensions, weariness and bleakness in his or her own family. We knew very well how important the FIRES programs were where we could turn to God again, stand in front of Him who is the ultimate source of life. At the same time, we could face ourselves, our difficulties and draw strength from God to continue after the pandemic.



We had two Engaged Encounters during this period, which got filled up very quickly with enthusiastic young couples.

We had one Original Marriage Encounter which filled up slowly, but thank God, eventually we ended up with a large group of married couples.

We also organized a Self Encounter for single persons so they can pause for a few days and dive into a deeper relationship with the Lord and eachother.



All of these retreats brought renewal and strengthened the participants in their relationships with eachother and God after all the difficulties of the pandemic.

All of us have been deeply touched by the past years' happenings. Nothing is so evident anymore like before. This makes all of us more and more thankful to God for every single retreat and all of their blessings.

IV. CFM Youth is present in three Hungarian cities, with ten communities in Érd, seven in Esztergom and three in Biatorbágy. A new development for 2021 is that, starting last autumn, a delegate from each of the couples leading CFM Youth groups will meet every six months to discuss possible joint programmes, learn from each other and consider ways to spread CFM Youth, seeing the huge demand and desire among families for the growth and spread of CFM Youth.

Regional News - CFM Bangalore:





CELL VISITS WITH NEW CHAPLAIN

Since all plans were held due to the covid pandemic EXCO has decided to start the cell visits with the new chaplain Rev. Fr. Prakash Fernando.



As a result, the first visit was to Walanagoda Cell on 6th March 2022. As the initiative was taken by the Rev. Fr. Sunil Kumara Peiris the former chaplain of CFM (2016 – 2021) with the assistance of CFM Colombo Diocese senior couple Anton & Margaret Fernandopulle, the cell was established in 2019 accompanied by the proposal of Rev Fr. Ruwan Reid Liyanage, the parish priest of Andiambalama with the abundant blessing of Almighty GOD. ULIRANG PAMILYA NG CFM 2021 (a 65th Anniversary Special)



CFM Philippines launched for the very first-time, a recognition of CFM families who have dedicated their lives in serving the Lord through service in the church and communities. With this, the "Ulirang Pamilya ng CFM" Awarding Ceremony was realized as a special part of the celebration of the 65th Anniversary of CFM Philippines.

The objective is to recognize and honor one (1) CFM family in every CFM area (from different parts of the country) who exemplifies CFM values. The family must possess the qualities of good stewardship to inspire other CFM families and soon to be CFMers.

Area Leaders convene to discern their respective Parish, Diocese and Area nominees. They were given criteria and indicator take aways from Amoris Laetitia. They are as follows:

- Life of prayer (AL, 28, 288)
- Life of service (AL, 127-129)
- Life of giving (AL, 196)
- Life of virtues (AL, 5, 136, 276)

Basically, the nominee families exemplifying the above are selflessly working towards blessing other families in various ways they could (spiritual and material). The chosen family manifests the CFM SOS spirit of sharing time, talent and treasure within the period of 2019 to 2021.
